

Dear AANR Youth, and Parents:

The American Association for Nude Recreation welcomes you to our **AANR Youth Leadership Program**. This year's program promises a fun-filled week of camping, games, learning, sharing, and friendships with nudist youth from across the country, structured for all two age groups: *Leadership Academy* (ages 15-18), and *Junior Campers* (ages 11-14). The selected host clubs will be perfect for this camping and outdoors experience.

The **AANR Youth Leadership Academy**, a 7-day, 6-night training and exploration experience for high school youth, is conducted in conjunction with our juniors' camp. Workshops and seminars, interspersed with games, sports, field trip, social activities, and a community project, are structured to reinforce the family experience of nudism as a safe, healthy, wholesome lifestyle choice, while permitting nudist teens an opportunity to practice their social skills. Leadership training is aimed at reinforcing body acceptance and at creating positive role models. As the week develops, the enthusiastic leadership academy participants will present and assist in positive decision-making and team-building activities with the younger campers as well as with our Nude U Leaders.

The **Juniors Camp**, a 7-day, 6-night camping experience for pre-high school aged youth, sets the stage for youth socialization and growth. Nudist etiquette and philosophy, skill building, as well as team sports and activities, affirm a positive nude experience. Essays are encouraged. Novice nudists are welcome as the programs are designed to allow all youth to feel safe in an unclothed environment. Camaraderie among adults, peer counselors, and campers builds a positive mind-set.

Parental permission is required for all Academy and Juniors candidates ages 11-18. Candidates are expected to be nude at all times----except for off site visits, weather, personal circumstances, or when program requirements dictate.

Our counselors and staff have over fifteen years of experience developing the AANR Youth Leadership Camp program. They represent professional people with law, politics, engineering, arts, education, music, nursing, sports, health and fitness backgrounds from all over the United States. Some adult counselors are former AANR youth campers. Our nudist counselors are veterans of the nudist experience and exemplify social nudism in its most wholesome family oriented form.

Please note that both academy and juniors arrive at noon on the same date. We thought this would give families time to spend at the host club before and/or after the camp. Parents will be responsible for their youth before camp begins and after camp closes at noon on the following Saturday and must pay all grounds fees. Contact the host club for reservations. Parents, grandparents, guardians, siblings, as well as members of the host club, are invited to our annual Sunny and Bare Show on the Friday evening at the end of camp. Contact the Camp Director for details, and to make reservations (you may notify when dropping off your youth for camp).

- Camp ends on Saturday, July 14 at 12:00 noon. Parents/guardian *must* pick up their youth at this time.
Deadline for registration for AANR-West Camp is June 17. Make checks payable to AANR-West.

AANR-East Youth Camp dates at Juniper Woods, New York Are:

- Leadership Academy: July 22 – July 28 - Arrival and Orientation – Sunday, 12:00 noon
 - Juniors Campers: July 22 – July 28 - Arrival and Orientation – Sunday, 12:00 noon
- Camp ends on Saturday, July 28 at 12:00 noon. Parents/guardian *must* pick up their youth at this time.
Deadline for registration for AANR-East Camp is July 1. Make checks payable to AANR-East.

The camp fee is all-inclusive; the juniors program and the leadership academy program is \$250.00. Pre-registration is essential to the pre-planning preparations of tents, food, etc. A \$25 late fee will be charged after the deadlines.

An AANR Youth Registration form that includes a release of liability and medical consent form and the code of conduct form are included. We request **both the parent and camper read, discuss, and sign ALL forms and return, along with the fees, as soon as possible to:**

Tents for the youth campers will be provided courtesy of the host region and tent assignments will be made by the camp director. However, each camper will need to bring a sleeping bag, pillow, two (2) towels, a flashlight, toiletries (tooth brush, toothpaste, soap, shampoo, hair brush, etc.), sunscreen, bug spray, prescription and/or special medications (discussed with camp nurse at time of registration), bathing suit & clothes (for off-site trip), flip-flops, walking shoes, and an old T-shirt to dye. In addition, we ask campers to bring costumes, music (CDs/tapes), musical instrument, etc. that they will need for their talent show/skit performance on Friday night. **MAKE SURE NAME IS CLEARLY MARKED ON ALL PERSONAL BELONGINGS!** We request you *LEAVE-AT-HOME* walkmans, boomboxes, electronics, valuables, handheld video games, etc. and contraband.

There will be a parent orientation meeting immediately after registration at noon on Sat. Parents can call the host club with emergency messages for delivery to the camp director. Directions to the host club can be obtained via www.aanr.com, click clubs.

Shuttle service will be provided to and from the local airport before and after camp. Participants wishing to utilize this shuttle service must contact the camp director with flight information to schedule this service. We ask all youth traveling unaccompanied by an adult to please carry the phone number of the host club in their immediate possession (on their person) in the event of an emergency.

The Nude U program will be from June 20-23 and the Youth Ambassador program will be from June 20-24 at Cypress Cove Resort in Kissimmee, Fla. Both of these programs are for young adults age 18-25.
