

Solair Top 10 "Ground Rules"

- We are a family-friendly environment and there is absolutely no sexual behavior allowed at any time.
- 2. NO Photographs of anyone or of our facilities, this includes yourself or places with no people in it.
- 3. Always sit on a towel.
- 4. For hygiene purposes, we request everyone to shower before using the hot tub or pool. Additionally, please towel off before transversing between the showers and the hot tub for the safety of all.
- 5. Our community seeks to foster a culture of mutual respect and civility. We expect everyone to be respectful of everyone.
- When the weather is appropriate, nudity is expected as we are NOT a clothingoptional resort. The beach, hot tub, pool area, showers, and sauna are nude-only areas
- Bathing suits, tops, or bottoms are NOT allowed anywhere in camp. Women who are menstruating can wear shorts or a sarong, but must still be nude while in the water.
- 8. If you are staying only for the day, you must exit by 9:00 p.m. Sunday through Thursday and by Midnight Friday and Saturday nights.
- Smoking or vaping is only allowed in the two posted smoking areas by pool and beach. Marijuana may only be used at private sites. Illegal drug use will not be tolerated.
- For the safety of all, no glass containers are allowed on the beach or in the fenced pool area.

Emergency Plan for Inclement Weather:


New England Summers are beautiful, and while the chances of a tornado are lower in some other parts of the country, we still have impressive storm systems that come through from time to time.

If a tornado watch or warning is issued, you are allowed to bring your pets on a leash or in a carrier to the community center.

The probability is not worth your life as your trailer or tent is not going to survive a hit by a falling tree or other debris.





WHEN A MOTION IS ON THE FLOOR:


- Speakers are limited to three minutes per speech.
- In the debate, each member has the right to speak only twice on the same question.
- Members cannot make a second speech so long as any member who has not spoken on the question desires the floor.
- Speakers shall be recognized to speak alternately for or against a pending motion.
- When speaking to a motion, the member should indicate whether he speaks in favor of the motion or in opposition.
- The presiding officer cannot cut off the debate as long as one member wishes to rise and speak.
- Any member can "move the previous question" which immediately stops debate. The
 motion needs a second, is not debatable, and requires a two-thirds vote to adopt.


The secretary/treasurer will record the results of each motion on the AANR Motion Form.
